Roller Derby Basics


In each standard roller derby game, two teams (of 15 skaters) play two 30-minute periods. Each period consists of multiple "jams." Each jam is an opportunity for both teams to score points.

The jam ends when the Lead Jammer calls off the jam or after 2 minutes has expired. It is legal for a skater to block opponents with their hips, rear, and shoulders. It is not legal to block to the back, to trip, elbow, hit in a counterdirection, or to back talk officials. Players committing illegal actions are penalized 30 seconds and sent to the penalty box. Their team plays short for that time.

The positions



Jammers wear a star on their helmets and are the scoring players for each team. The Jammers attempt to pass the opponents as many times as possible by sprinting around the track and lapping the pack.




The Blockers are simultaneously focused on stopping the opposing Jammer from passing them and assisting their Jammer to pass the opposing team's Blockers.

The pack is formed by the largest group of Blockers with players from each team on the track.



The Pivot is the Blocker that wears the stripe on their helmet cover. They are the only Blocker that is allowed to accept a star pass from the Jammer, thus becoming the new Jammer and gaining the ability to score points.

Basic Gameplay



legally pass all skaters in the pack is designated Lead Jammer. Lead Jammer status is signaled by the officials blowing two short whistle blasts and pointing at

the Lead Jammer.



Frequently Asked Questions

Why do the skaters intentionally skate in the opposite direction sometimes?

When a player goes beyond the track or out of bounds (by their own skating and falling or by being pushed/hit out) they must return to the track BEHIND the player who put them out or who was position in front of them on the track. So, in order to maximize the advantage of a player being knocked out of bounds, the opposing team will quickly skate the opposite direction in order to make the returning player have re-enter the track the furthest back possible. If the referees see the pushed out player re-entering the track ahead of players who were in front of them, they'll receive a "cutting the track" penalty.

Things to remember:

- The rules are all based on keeping the pack together. So all the blockers and pivots need to remain within 20 feet of the largest collection of skaters from both teams.
- If a skater is too far in front or too far behind the pack she is not permitted to block/hit any opponents or assist their own players. If they do, they'll receive an "out of play" penalty.

What is a "power jam"?

A power jam is the advantage a team gains when the opposing jammer is in the penalty box. During this time there is only one jammer on the track earning points. Since there is no opposing jammer to worry about during a power jam, the team with the advantage can concentrate solely on offence. They will try anything necessary to get their jammer to lap the pack as many times possible (to score as many points as possible) before the opposing jammer is released from the penalty box.

<u>ABOUT OYRD</u>

Ottawa Valley Roller Derby is a WFTDA certified, full-contact, flat-track, roller derby league. Historically we are a merge of two Ottawa-based leagues: Rideau Valley Roller Derby and Capital City Derby Dolls.

OVRD is an inclusive league. Our members are from all genders and all gender expressions. Our women+ teams welcome trans women, intersex women, non binary persons, and gender expansive skaters.

We have four adult teams and a junior roller derby program for skaters under 18 years old. Our two house league adult mixed gender teams are the **Valley Cats** (in green) and the **Street Rats** (in yellow). The **OVRD Rapids** is our travel A-team and represent the league on the international level within the WFTDA system. We also have a new for 2025 travel B-team: the **OVRD Riptides**.

IN THE LINE UP

UNDER DOG PALE ALE (5.2 % ALC. /VOL)

Pouring a pale burnt orange with a moderate white head. Aromas of citrus and grapefruit supported by hints of pine and a slight malt sweetness.

AMBER ALE (5.0 % ALC. /VOL)

Pours brilliant amber in colour with floral, fruity and citrus hop aromas, offering notes of caramel sweetness balanced by a crisp, lightly bitter finish.

LIGHT (3.5 % ALC. /VOL)

Pours pale gold in colour, offering subtle bready aromas and flavours, balanced by a slight hop bitterness and a clean, refreshing finish.

NEIPA (6.4 % ALC. /VOL)

Pours straw in colour and intentionally hazy with big tropical and citrus aromas, giving way to bright stone fruit flavours and an incredibly juicy mouthfeel.
